2013 Tax Amnesty Program Report

In 2004, the Nebraska Department of Revenue (Department) conducted a tax amnesty program. Taxpayers were given an opportunity to apply for tax amnesty and pay all unreported taxes that were due before April 1, 2004. The Department of Revenue Enforcement Fund (Enforcement Fund) and the Department of Revenue Technology Fund (Technology Fund) were created as a part of this program. The Technology Fund was terminated on July 1, 2006. The Enforcement Fund is now supported by collections resulting from the continuation of the efforts of Department employees that were hired with funds initially generated by the 2004 tax amnesty program for the purpose of increased enforcement. In addition to these funds, \$43,900 was transferred from the Civic and Community Center Financing Fund to the Enforcement Fund on July 1, 2013.*

In accordance with the filing and reporting requirements outlined in <u>Neb. Rev. Stat § 77-5601</u>, the Department submits this Report on Results of the Tax Amnesty Program.

- 1 No proceeds from the Enforcement Fund were used to hire new positions in 2013.
- 2. Proceeds from the Enforcement Fund were used to purchase the following items in 2013:
 - Software to upgrade some of the present database technology; and
 - License fees for existing software.
- 3. In 2013, \$8.98 million in delinquent tax revenue was collected. This amount is 37.8% more than the collection total of \$6.52 million in 2012.
